On behalf of JSCE members, I am delighted to announce that JSCE marks its 100th anniversary in November 2014. JSCE holds a three-day-long celebration, including 100th Anniversary Commemorative Ceremony and Banquet, International Forum, and 3rd Roundtable Meeting on Disaster Management from the 19 to 21 of the month.

Over the past 100 years, Japanese civil engineers have improved their practices to ensure the safety and well-being of people in cooperation with their colleagues around the world.

As the turn of the 21st century, civil engineers have played an increasingly important role in addressing globalization challenges, including natural disasters, food and water shortages, energy scarcity, poverty, and traffic problems. <JSCE: A Centennial History 1914-2014>

Japan Society of Civil Engineers (JSCE) is a Japanese civil engineering professional organization established in 1914, representing approximately 36,000 members. Since its establishment, JSCE has contributed to civil engineering progress, infrastructure development and well-being of society and worked with 300 committees and 9 International Sections to pursue its goal

JSCE’s mission is to contribute to create a sustainable society through civil engineering practices. In order to achieve the mission, JSCE focuses on the following goals:

- 1) Enhance professional knowledge, skills and practices;
- 2) Strengthen the contribution of civil engineering to society; and
- 3) Promote communication, cooperation and collaboration among the members.

The members commit themselves to improve their professional practices, tackle various challenges and fulfill their responsibilities to society. Their commitment to civil engineering instills a strong sense of pride, honor and integrity among themselves.

In 2014, JSCE will mark its 100th anniversary and will carry out centennial projects on the theme “social contribution,” “international contribution,” and “citizens interaction” for achieving a resilient society, and for building the society that next generations will enjoy. The International Symposium will offer a comprehensive review of the past achievements and future civil engineering.

JSCE TIMELINE


- 1879 The Japan Federation of Engineering Societies is established by 23 graduates of the Imperial College of Engineering, including 3 civil engineers. With disciplinary development of engineering, many professional societies have stemmed from the JFES.
- 1914 Japan Society of Civil Engineers is founded, and Koi Furuichi is the first president.
- 1937 Creates The Beliefs and Principles of Practice for Civil Engineers.
- 1999 Establishes Code of Ethics for Civil Engineers
- 2014 Celebrates the 100th anniversary
